

## **2022 Operating Supplemental Budget Special Education Highlights**

Program Area	Final Budget
Special Education Funding	<b>+\$13 million</b> To support the special education safety net program.
<b>Office of the Education Ombuds (OEO)</b> Provides support to families in addressing their concerns or barriers encountered within the public education system	<b>+\$557,000</b> To increase capacity of <u>OEO</u> to support more families.
Trauma-Informed Support Workgroup	<b>+\$200,000</b> For the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) to convene a workgroup to identify trauma- informed strategies, approaches, and curricula for supporting students in distress and with challenging behaviors.
Language Access	<b>+\$409,000</b> For OSPI to implement a language access technical assistance program and directs the Washington State School Directors Association (WSSDA) to develop a model policy for implementing a language access program for culturally responsive, systemic family engagement ( <u>House Bill 1153</u> ).
Student Mental Health	<b>+\$90 million</b> To increase funding for staffing that support the physical, social, and emotional health of students. ( <u>House Bill</u> <u>1664</u> ) (Ex., counselors, nurses, social workers)
Out-of-State Placements Report	<b>+\$50,000</b> For OSPI to create and annual report on the use of out-of- state placements for students receiving special education services
